

**NOTICE TO MEMBERS: CLASS ACTION AGAINST
BELL CANADA**

**SLOWDOWN OF PEER TO PEER (P2P) APPLICATIONS FOR
RESIDENTIAL ADSL INTERNET SERVICES SUBSCRIBERS FROM
OCTOBER 28, 2007 TO FEBRUARY 29, 2012**

Union des consommateurs and Myrna Raphaël v. Bell Canada

On July 12, 2012, the Court of Appeal of Quebec authorized a class action on behalf of Bell Canada's residential ADSL Internet services subscribers in Quebec and in Ontario who used peer to peer file sharing applications (P2P) that were slowed down between 4:30 p.m. and 2:00 a.m, for the period from October 28, 2007 to February 29, 2012. These services have been marketed notably under one of the following trade names or marks: TOTAL INTERNET ESSENTIAL, TOTAL INTERNET ESSENTIAL PLUS, TOTAL INTERNET PERFORMANCE, TOTAL INTERNET PERFORMANCE PLUS, TOTAL INTERNET MAX, SYMPATICO HIGH SPEED, SYMPATICO INTERNET HIGH SPEED ULTRA, SYMPATICO BASIC.

The Court will be called upon to decide if, during this period, Bell Canada has made misleading representations to subscribers of these services regarding the constancy of the speed and/or if Bell has breached its contractual and legal obligations in systematically reducing the speed of these services during peak hours, without advising them beforehand.

The Court has not yet ruled on the class action, nor on any compensation that may be awarded to class members.

The full text describes the principal issues to be dealt with in the class action and the conclusions sought. In the event of a discrepancy between the present notice and the full text of the notice, the latter prevails.

If you wish to remain a class member, you have nothing to do. On the other hand, if you wish to exclude yourself from the class action, you have until **April 30, 2016** to advise the registry of the Superior Court of Quebec, District of Montreal, at 1 Notre Dame St. East, Montreal, Quebec, H2Y 1B6 by registered mail.
